

Job Description: Sign Fabrication & Production Assistant (FPA)

Key Responsibilities:

- Operate equipment including CNC router, engraving machines, plotters and traditional woodworking tools
- Timely fabrication with an eye on the delivery dates set by project managers and management team
- Pre-press production file set up using graphics programs as necessary
- Painting – brush/roller
- Finish assembly using hardware and chemical adhesives
- Assist installation team when necessary at locations outside of shop
- Daily housekeeping of shop and workstations
- Perform all additional tasks as required by Fabrication & Production Lead or Production Manager

Career Path: Sign Fabrication & Production Lead or Sign & Graphics Installer

A FPA works day-to-day in the shop producing products sold by the organization. This includes, but is not limited to dimensional letters, architectural signage, vinyl graphics and monument signs. This position needs a high level of organization and dedication to quality and detail. A typical work week is Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. through 4:30 p.m. Occasional weekend or overtime work may be required.

The FPA provides task level support to Fabrication & Production Lead to ensure the smooth and timely completion of projects. Must be able to deal with challenges while maintaining professionalism and focus on the project goals. The FPA must be able to prioritize multiple projects with different lead times with minimal direction; yet work in coordination with the team. Participation in the Company benefits program may be offered after a 60-day probation period as outlined in the Company Employee Handbook.
